Dear Seeley Lake Sewer Board,

In light of the recent failed district bond election, we are reaching out on how to proceed with the existing interlocal agreement between the Seeley Lake Sewer Board and Missoula County. This agreement, which was predicated on the sewer being constructed, is set to expire later this year.

We know this is a difficult time for the board, as you've given so many hours to shepherd the development and approval of the system's plan and secure \$10 million on federal grants. While revising and updating the interlocal agreement is an important step, it is important for the board to take time to consider the future of the board and sewer and what paths might be available going forward. We believe updating the interlocal with the changes that follow will allow the district and county opportunities to collaborate in the future.

The next period of time will be crucial for the board as it considers its future and the future of the project. As part of that deliberation, it makes sense to us that we would revise the interlocal to reflect the current realities while also allowing for future collaboration between the board and county. Much of what the interlocal provided for was the assistance of staff in the areas of assessment methodologies, collection of assessments and general office support, as well as use of the office building in Seeley Lake for board meetings. We believe most of these areas can continue in what we assume will be a more limited meeting schedule.

Much of the rest of the agreement provided funding or services contingent on the construction of the sewer. The county proposes that the board finish its repayment of the \$21,912 advanced to the board. We will remove the funding that was pledged from the revolving loan fund, with the understanding that there may be a future ask should the project move forward. We would also remove the provision for backup operators, with the same caveat that this may need to be revisited in the future should the project move forward.

We believe these revisions are necessary as we look to renew the current interlocal agreement, which ends Oct. 19, 2021, and to accurately reflect the current circumstances.

Hello,

I am writing regarding the future of Seeley Sewer District. As per our previous conversions, it is my understanding that Missoula County prioritized the Seeley Sewer project for the federal money coming into Montana. The District appreciates your support.

I am looking for some clarification. I understand that Missoula County was allocated \$24M or thereabouts. I just want to be clear that you are not proposing using the majority of that allocation for one project, correct? I talked with Anna Miller at DNRC in Helena and she thought the legislature had set aside \$2M for Missoula County projects and added a penalty for counties with strict covid rules. I know that Rep. Mike Hopkins and others in the Missoula delegation started out asking for full funding for the Seeley Project, an estimated \$21 M for the treatment plant, phase 1 and phase 2 or an estimated \$31M for the whole project. I understand the Legislature will recess while their proposals are reviewed by the federal government. So please provide any updated information you may have.

Secondly, I have a suggestion. If there is not full funding for the project, which is unlikely, maybe the Commissioners and the Health Department could focus some of the county allotment to Seeley Lake. While we have a documented issue with high nitrates in the area, additional data would build a better case for the future. The District has budgeted to add 5 test wells but does not have an engineer or water specialist opinion as to where they should be located. All of the grant money is gone so they will not be hiring anyone. They have plans to use volunteers but experts in the field to guide their decisions would be helpful.

The Health Dept is going to have to make decisions when people come in for a replacement septic system or when someone wants to develop a vacant lot. More data is crucial so investing some of the federal money in protecting this watershed would benefit more than Seeley Lake.

I am sure you have already had this conversation internally and Shannon was kind enough to join the District's April meeting and support the additional research. This volunteer board could use some guidance.

Hello, After reviewing the 3 proposed budget funding options for 2022 I would like to voice my concern over Option 3, and ask you not to vote for this funding option. This funding option penalizes individual families who have more property regardless of the amount of waste they would produce. Personally, we paid about \$400 for the 2021 budget, which was a 187% increase from 2020. Under Option 3 for 2022 we would be asked to pay over \$10,000. For a family of 2 that is a massive increase, which would create an undue hardship. It doesn't seem like a fair way to divide the budget when you are asking one family to pay 8.5% of your entire community budget. This is more than any commercial property is being asked to pay, with the exception of the mill, even though we wouldn't produce nearly the same amount of waste. I would ask that you look at the other options that provide a more fair and equitable way to divide up the cost of budget for 2022. Thank you for your time and consideration.

The meeting was called to order by Tom Morris at 6:01pm. The meeting was held remotely via Zoom, due to COVID-19.

Beth Hutchinson noted that the first sentence of the last motion on page 7 did not make sense as stated and requested that "(is inserted)" be added at the end of the sentence for clarification. There were no objections from the Board to the addition.

Tom Morris moved to approve the minutes of the March 18, 2021 Board Meeting as amended. Jason Gilpin seconded the motion. There was no discussion. The motion was carried.

FINANCIAL REPORTS:

Invoices - March 2021

Beth Hutchinson requested discussion on the general business attorney's invoices and when the work had been authorized, as the Board had wanted to avoid large attorney bills. Discussion followed on the attorney's research of alternative systems, the by-laws, and who was approved to instruct the attorney. Tom Morris reminded the Board that there was an ongoing lawsuit and the attorney had been hired to protect the District from legal issues.

Jean Curtiss reviewed the proposed grant funds that would be used to reimburse the District for the Dorsey & Whitney invoice, noting that there would be minimal or no District match.

Pat Goodover moved to approve all of the invoices for payment as explained. Tom Morris seconded the motion. Discussion followed with Nathan Bourne as to if any of the general business counsel's time could be paid for by the insurance company. There was no further discussion. The motion was carried.

Financial Reports - February 2021

Felicity Derry reviewed the February 2021 financial reports. Discussion followed on the reserve funds, how they had been expended and creating a report of the expenditures. The well monitoring expenditures for the year were discussed.

MANAGER'S REPORT:

Jean Curtiss had sent a letter to the editor regarding the FY2022 draft budget. The advertisement for the vacant director position ran. Aaron Neilson had reviewed the different assessment methodologies.

Jean Curtiss noted that the DNRC land for the proposed treatment plant was an easement and not a lease. A letter should be sent to DNRC suggesting that even though the land would not be used as designated, it could be held.

MACo communicated that they would not insure the District. Cincinnati Insurance would send premium renewals in June.

Jean Curtiss informed the Board that she would complete the budget and assessment process, but planned to resign as of June 30. 2021.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS:

Legal Update

Jean Curtiss noted that the plaintiffs had been granted an extension until April 19, 2021 to respond to the summary judgement.

Proposed Action Plan for 2021-2022

Beth Hutchinson outlined a plan where directors would assign several hours a week to various tasks to develop a layered GIS map of the District. By bringing a plethora of data together the map could identify areas of concern. This map could be a tool to communicate with the constituents and an opportunity to work with the Health Department.

Obtaining the base GIS map, acquiring the information and adding it to the map were discussed. Colleen Krause volunteered to collect email addresses from people around the lake. The discussion turned to whether Board members would be able to volunteer a couple of hours a week to this project. It was agreed that Beth Hutchinson should present a more concrete plan at the May meeting.

Shannon Therriault was looking forward to a constructive relationship with the District. The Health Department was hoping to secure funds to study the nitrate issue in conjunction with the District and by sharing data, could provide some layers for the District's GIS map.

Interim General Manager

Beth Hutchinson proposed that there could be an interim general manager for a year, and reviewed what that position would entail and how reducing the number of hours would affect the FY2022 budget. Discussion followed on a job description, what a realistic number of hours would be for an interim general manager position and whether the District should become an employer. There was further discussion on the amount that should be budgeted for this position.

FY2022 Budget

Jean Curtiss shared the draft working FY2022 budget document. The discussion continued on the amount that should be budgeted for the manager position. The Board discussed that the Secretary had not had a pay increase in a long time and agreed to a \$3 an hour increase. The bookkeeping and legal expenses were reviewed and discussed. After the discussed amendments to the draft FY2022 budget had been made Tom Morris requested public comment.

Nick Hogan commented that the Board didn't have the necessary paperwork to drill the wells and questioned if it was realistic to anticipate drilling the five wells in 2022. Where and when the wells should be drilled was discussed. Shannon Therriault noted that the Health Department was supportive of drilling the additional wells and requested that the District work with the Health Department. The Board agreed that the five wells should remain in the FY2022 budget.

The Board discussed and agreed to repay the County loan in 2022. When an income survey could be completed and what the information would be used for was discussed. Whether Rural Development funds could be used for a smaller system was discussed. There was discussion on the money budgeted for the income survey in the FY2021 budget and how that could affect the FY2022 budget.

The reserve, the budget line items and budget overages were discussed. The discussion turned to amending the budget for overages as needed. The Board agreed that the income survey should be added to the FY2022 budget. Adding money to the budget for the reserve and how much money was expected to be in the reserve at the end of the FY2021. Delaying approving the budget until May was discussed. The Board reviewed the current amount of the reserve and agreed it was adequate. How to best present all of the pertinent financial information to the Board was discussed.

Pat Goodover moved to approve the FY2022 operating budget of \$124,102. Tom Morris seconded the motion.

Michael Richards suggested that the public should have a month to review the budget and comment prior to the Board's approval. Jean Curtiss noted that the budget had been discussed and amended at the previous meeting. The budget had been posted on the website. Tom Morris appreciated Michael Richards' comments; however, the proposed budget had been discussed at the March meeting with a projection to adopt the budget at the April meeting, to allow time for the public to review and comment.

Colleen Krause felt that the amount budgeted to pay the manager was too much.

The Missoula County bank account, how the County disseminates that information and the reserve were discussed.

Tom Morris noted that there was a motion and a second. There was no further discussion. The motion was carried.

<u>Assessment Methodology</u>

Jean Curtiss noted that the three assessment methodologies (equal rate, taxable market value and residential, commercial and vacant land options) were shown on the spreadsheet. Kim Myre shared the spreadsheets on her computer screen. Kim Myre reviewed and gave background for the three different assessment methodologies shown.

Colleen Krause questioned what her assessment would be. Kim Myre reviewed the three different options for Colleen Krause and then for Pyramid Mountain Lumber. Nathan Bourne's properties were reviewed at his request. The assessments for several other properties were also reviewed.

The Board agreed that the spreadsheet should be posted on the website for review. Discussion followed on the spread of the third assessment option for the different kinds of properties.

Jean Curtiss reviewed the timeline for the assessment methodology. Discussion followed.

Tom Morris requested public comment on the assessment methodology. There were no public comments.

Appointing a Director/Appointment Committee Report

Tom Morris noted that the interview questions had been collected. Jean Curtiss then read the questions. The Board discussed the questions and agreed to include them all.

It was noted that there had been one application. The procedure for seating the new director was reviewed. The Board discussed and agreed to hold a special meeting to interview for and then appoint a new director. The questions were discussed further and the Board agreed to email the questions to the candidate prior to the meeting.

Insurance Premium

This had been covered in the Manager's Report.

NEW BUSINESS:

Funding Final Report

Jean Curtiss shared the document on the computer screen and then reviewed the grant funds listed in the document that would be returned to the funding agencies. Other miscellaneous project expenses were also reviewed. Nathan Bourne questioned if the proposed Missoula County O&M subsidy money could be repurposed to the Health Department study. Shannon Therriault added that it had been discussed with the County Commissioners, but there had been no final decision.

GWE Contract

Jean Curtiss noted that Aaron Neilson had worked on a mutual release for the GWE contracts. It would be finalized once all of the final figures had been confirmed. As the Board had previously agreed to terminate the GWE contract, it was agreed that no further action was needed for Tom Morris to sign the release.

<u>Alternative Systems</u>

Beth Hutchinson moved to table this item until the July meeting. Tom Morris seconded the motion. There was no discussion. The motion was carried.

Here is my input for your April Sewer Board meeting. My Seeley Lake property is 250 A Street which my husband, Jim Patterson, and I purchased in 1963. The assessment decision made by your Board for 2020 raised my property tax by \$1571.83 for the year to \$6450.48. My husband died in 2015 and my income is mainly Social Security, and this assessment has placed a real hardship on me.

I want to encourage your Board to 1) assess all so-called users, ie residential properties, EQUALLY and 2) decide how to fairly assess businesses. A very thriving business such as Roveros should pay more than the humble and not too busy flower shop. This would erase any bitterness towards your efforts by lake owners.

One longtime Seeley resident told me he thinks the County should evaluate each property's septic system, instruct owners with deficient systems to spend the money needed to bring their systems up to code, and thereby clean up the area. Businesses & motels could have their own systems without making the individual residences pay for them. Roughly 10 years ago, my husband and I hired Gary Lewis to put in a new sewer system for us; it is registered as correct with Missoula County. My Seeley Lake close neighbor to the north is Mike Richards. He has a totally new & correct system.

Please consider my ideas without taking the easy way out & going with property valuations. We lake owners had nothing to do with those valuations going so high, and most of us would not think of selling the property. Family ties run deep with these places in beautiful Seeley Lake.

Thank you for considering my ideas.



Nonprofit organizations have the best intentions for their clients and society, operating to the benefit of their communities. Consumer protection laws violation

A potential buyer sued a club that hosted a charity auction after one of the items up for bid could not be made available due to a processing error. The matter settled for \$400,000 with \$250,000 in defense costs.

Breach of fiduciary duty

A member of a private club alleged its board had failed to follow its bylaws in its handling of assessments, thus breaching its fiduciary responsibilities. Nearly \$150,000 was paid in defense costs.

Breach of duty of bailee

A benefactor filed a lawsuit against an organization alleging its leadership failed to return an item the sponsor had considered only to be a loan, and not a gift. More than \$200,000 was paid in defense costs.

Former club members sued the club's board relating to a proposed change in the refund policy for membership investments to the club. More than \$75,000 was paid in defense costs.

Breach of constructive trust

Members sued a cooperative regarding its methods of recording and managing profits, as well as member distributions. The **\$1 million** policy limit was exhausted in defense costs while the claim was still in litigation.



Overview: The Seeley Lake Sewer District Board of Directors will focus on assembling and organizing in an understandable manner comprehensive information to inform board members and constituents about wastewater issues within the district, to develop resource bases regarding acceptable treatment methods, to explore and document possible funding avenues and to develop more effective methods to communicate with constituents.

Board members will engage directly in research and related tasks in order to both have a more immediate grasp of issues and relevant content matter as well as to support a fiscally conservative budget for the welfare of district property owners. By the end of the 2021-2022 period, the board will be able to more fully and accurately define the character and specific needs that should be addressed to improve and/or maintain appropriate groundwater conditions in the district

The Directors will hire an interim general manager as a part-time, contracted employee to focus particularly on supporting board members as they engage in more hands-on work, to edit the website make materials more easily accessible to the pubic, and to pursue specific tasks assigned by the board. For this calendar year, the district requires a general manager with strong organizational and communication skills.

Goals/Tasks:

Improve capacity to communicate regarding wastewater conditions within the district:

- ---Develop a labeling system that is easily accessed regarding each parcel, and relevant groups of parcels in the district.
- ---Secure email addresses and phone numbers for district property owners and renters.
- ---Develop intentional storage guidelines for website, reorganize where documents are stored to extent necessary and develop an index to guide users.
- ---Create a digital newsletter to be issues 3 times a year in February, June and October to bring constituents and other interested parties up-to-date on board activities, concerns, etc. Distribute via email and website.
- ---Develop written lists of resources (people, agencies, possible partners, possible suppliers and the like).
- ---Develop PR package to clearly delineate current goals, activities, story line.

Assemble data regarding current wastewater treatment systems and issues within the district:

Interim General Manager

General Summary:

The Seeley Lake Sewer District Board of Directors is in the process of refining its activities in order to update many areas of information, to develop broader communication approaches with constituents and to organize structures for storing information and making it functionally available for board use and evaluation. Montana Code Amended (M.C.A.) requires that each sewer district employ a general manager. For the immediate and foreseeable future, the Seeley Lake Sewer District will accommodate this mandate by hiring a contracted employee with skills chiefly in the realm of information gathering and organization. The position will entail working on board requested tasks for approximately 10 hours (10-15) per week. The "interim" status may continue for at least one year, possibly longer. Hiring preference will be given to district, town, county resident, in that order, providing a qualified candidate is available.

{Note to board: The number of hours is somewhat challenging to define because we don't want to pay for the employee having considerable time with no direction and, yet at this time, we have no program of tasks for the person to pursue efficiently.)

Reporting Relationships:

The Interim General Manage functions under the supervision of the Board of Directors, communicates and follows the direction of the board president between meetings and supports activities of individual board members for a certain number of hours per month at their request.

Essential Duties and Responsibilities:

- 1. To be knowledgeable of Montana state and Missoula County water and wastewater codes, support offices, etc.,
- 2. To meet any specific requirements entailed in the M.C.A. requirement that the district have a general manager,
- 3. To pursue board directed/assigned activities as assigned, particularly in the areas of research, organization of information, developing lines of communication with government agencies and possible support/funding partners, assisting with policy development, engaging in public relations, etc.,
- 4. To oversee and coordinate with other district personnel in accomplishing board assigned activities,
- 5. To work with the board president in administrative tasks, particularly organizing board meetings,
- 6. To attend board meetings, including some that may be called on short notice, and to make a focused report on relevant activities,
- 7. To support individual board members in their board recognized tasks for up to 2 hours/month at the board member's request,

- 8. To prepare a focused, written report of time and tasks on a monthly basis to share with board members prior to monthly meetings,
- 9. To communicate effectively both orally and in writing with a broad range of individuals, institutions, and circumstances

Qualifications and Skills:

- 1. To be a high school graduate with some college and/or relevant work experience that supports capacity to successfully carry out essential duties and responsibilities,
- 2. To have knowledge of/experience in goal setting, program and budget development, and personnel supervision,
- 3. To have strong communication (including current technological methods), organization and research skills,
- 4. To establish and maintain a positive, effective working relationship with wide range of individuals and to be able to constructively deal with both positive and negative criticism,
- 5. To exercise sound, independent judgment within general policy guidelines (*** board needs to develop this list of policies...Tom started, i.e., board approved goals/objectives, board approved messages for media/website, board approved contact with legal counsel, etc.)
- 6. To have flexibility in scheduling,
- 7. To operate programs within allocated time and fiscal budgets,
- 8. To be capable of writing basic grants.

Work Environment:

As contracted employees, candidates will be expected to do much work from a home office utilizing own equipment and providing own transportation when needed to pursue assigned tasks. Meetings with other district staff and monthly board meetings take place at various sites throughout the district. Face-to-face meetings with individuals outside the district parameters may be needed, but will be the exception. Travel by vehicle and on foot may be needed within the district.

Evaluation:

An initial, formal evaluation will be provided by the president with cooperation from the Board of Directors after 3 months of service. Thereafter, an annual evaluation will be conducted, unless circumstances mandate otherwise. **The General Manager serves at the discretion of the Board of Directors.**

Sewer district manager job description:

- 1. Must have knowledge and understanding of M.C.A.s concerning water and sewer districts.
- 2. Knowledge of and ability to write grants is preferred.
- 3. Must be willing to work directly with the Sewer board president, and follow instructions and fulfill duties as instructed.
- 4. Must be able to set aside personal preferences and follow and strive to achieve the goals and objectives of the Board.
- 5. Must be able to receive public criticism.
- 6. Must only speak to the media and others about District matters after receiving permission from the Board.
- 7. Must have computer and other technical skills required for online meetings and conference calls / meetings.
- 8. Must be willing to attend and participate in meetings on short notice.
- 9. Must be willing to visit the legislature for the purpose of representing the goals and needs of the Board.
- 10. Must always wait for permission from the full Board to use or consult with legal council.
- 11. Must be fiscally responsible and work to help the Board stay on track fiscally.
- 12. Must have permission from the whole board before performing duties that would be over the budgeted amount.
- 13. Must have board approval before posting news articles and or articles on the District website.
- 14. Must be willing to work as a contractor, and still be accountable to the Board for all actions.
- 15. Must share any and all information concerning litigation against the District immediately with the whole board.

As you know, the Seeley Lake Sewer District applied for STAG funds through the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency. The District was awarded \$733,333 for the project period of 09/01/2006 to 6/30/2019 to be matched with \$600,000 in other funds.

The final design for the Seeley Lake Sewer District treatment plant and the phase 1 collection system was completed and approved by MT DEQ on April 21, 2020. While the District had over \$10M in grants for this portion of the project, the qualified voters in the District had to approve bonds to repay the low interest loan portion of the \$17 M project. On February 23, 2021, the District held a bond election and the qualified voters failed to approve the bonds.

Without a method to repay the loan portion of the project, the Board is not able to go forward and build the approved project.

This letter is to inform you of that decision and release the remaining \$513,840.06 of the EPA/STAG award.

As you know, in June of 2015, the Seeley Lake Sewer District was awarded \$750,000 in TSEP funds, by the 2015 Montana Legislature for the construction of a wastewater treatment plant and the first phase of the collection system in Seeley Lake.

The Department has been very patient and has extended the deadline to use this money more than once. The treatment plant and phase 1 collection system were designed and approved by DEQ in April of 2020. The Board asked the qualified voters in the District to approve bonds to repay the loan portion of this \$17M project on February 23, 2021. The voters did not approve the bonds, so this project cannot go forward at this time. Therefore, the Board is releasing the TSEP CG 15-757 grant funds.

The 2021 Montana Legislature considered the Seeley Lake Sewer District application for \$750,000 in TSEP funds for Phase 2 of the collection system. This application was included in HB 11. The District is also releasing those funds. We are not able to construct the treatment plant and phase 1 collection system, so we will not have a system to connect the phase 2 collection system to.

Permit MTX000234, is a Class I groundwater discharge permit located in the NE ¼ of Section 36, Township 17N, Range 15 W, PMM, in Powell County.

We ask that this termination be immediate and therefore, will not be submitting payment for invoice no. 5L2101410 for the annual review.

In February of 2015, easements were executed on DNRC State Lands in Powell County, near Seeley Lake to be used by the Seeley Lake Sewer District for a public wastewater treatment plant, drainfields, test wells, access roads and utility easements.

The easement was to be 'put to use for the intended purpose' within 5 years of the agreement. The Seeley Lake Sewer District has worked closely with DNRC staff, especially Anna Miller, to bring this project to fruition. While we did not meet the 5-year deadline, we were on track to get this project out to bid.

The treatment plant and Phase 1 of the collection system were designed and approved by DEQ in April 2020. While the District had \$10.57 M in grants for the project, the qualified voters had to approve the needed bonds to repay the low interest loans to complete a full funding package. Sadly, in February 2021, the qualified voters did not approve the necessary bonds, so the project is at a standstill without sufficient funding.

The agreements with Montana DNRC state the easement shall terminate upon notice that the land will cease to be used for the purpose granted. This letter is to notify Montana DNRC that the Seeley Lake Sewer District is not financially able to construct the public wastewater system within the timeline outlined in our agreements.

There continues to be a need for a public wastewater treatment system in Seeley Lake to address elevated nitrates in groundwater. The designed and approved system would reduce the nitrates going into the groundwater and protect state waters. While our agreements with Montana DNRC require the Seeley Lake Sewer District to notify the department if use is discontinued and we are notifying you that use never began, it does not say the department cannot delay termination in hopes that this important infrastructure will be constructed in the future. Delaying termination would provide an opportunity to benefit the environment in Seeley Lake and the Clearwater Valley in the future.
